Mr. Meredith has over 35 years of experience in the federal government sector – at the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) and in the Department of Defense (at a predecessor agency to the National Geospatial-Intelligence Agency), with over 25 years as a supervisor/manager. Mr. Meredith has strong traditional management skills, highly developed emotional intelligence, and a passion to promote human

professional development through leadership development and mentoring. He has a strong servant leadership style and was a prolific mentor and coach of staff and managers throughout the EPA, in both formal and informal contexts, over the previous 12 years, while serving as a manager in EPA's enforcement and compliance assurance program.

Experience

Mr. Meredith has a wide variety of experiences and accomplishments as a staff, senior staff, team leader, special assistant, supervisor, manager, and senior advisor during the last four decades of work for the U.S. government. He has benefitted from a tremendous amount of relevant internally funded or provided training programs as well as from his own reading on subjects that relate to his ability to effectively manage in the highly diverse human resource environment of the federal government.
